### Comments:

The Patriots came 4.5 points short of winning a 7<sup>th</sup> state trophy in 2010. As is, the Patriots have finished in the top 5 at state 9 years in a row, and have finished in the top 3 the last 7 years in a row. The team finished with 9 state placers this year which was one more than the runner-up team from a year ago. This team also outscored last year's team by over 10 points. The Patriots have also had a state champion for 8 years running as Kyle Miller brought home the Gold this year.

“We had a tremendous run this year at State. Most years, 9 state placers and 157 points would put you in the hunt to win class A. It was extra special having all 14 wrestlers win at least one match at state. Every wrestler was a contributor to the overall effort,” coach Denson.

“I don’t think anyone gave us a chance to finish this high. If you would have asked anyone if Jesse Childers would have won two matches, or Kyle Miller would have been a state champion, most people would have said ‘impossible’ but our guys don’t know that word,” said coach Olson.

“Our guys really came to state ready to perform. The guys who had been here before did a great job leading the team. Jake Miller showed why he ended his career as a three time finalist and four time state placer. He put the team on his shoulders this past weekend. His Senior leadership was invaluable to the team,” said coach Meneely.
